PROPOSED ENFORCEMENT ORDER

SRI LANKA ELECTRICITY ACT NO. 20 OF 2009

Whereas the Public Utilities Commission of Sri Lanka (the Commission) is satisfied that the Ceylon Electricity Board (holder of license no. EL/T/09-002 and herein after referred to as the Licensee) is contravening or likely to contravene Condition 4(1) of Part II of the General Conditions spelled out under the said License No. EL/T/09-002, by not adhering to the directive given by the Commission “ to offer the approved tariff for any Generation Licensee who wishes to operate and sell electricity using a Non-Conventional Renewable Energy based generation plant, having capacities below 10 MW, under the Standard Power Purchase Agreements (SPPAs) signed during the period from 1st January 2012 to 31st December 2013” as per its Decision on Non-Conventional Renewable Energy Purchasing Tariffs: 2012-2013 issued by the Commission on 5th October 2012, the consequence being that the Licensee is in breach of and likely to continue to be in breach of its obligations under the aforesaid license granted by the Commission.

Now therefore the Commission, pursuant to its duties under sections 34 of the Sri Lanka Electricity Act No. 20 of 2009, hereby orders, for the purpose of securing compliance with Condition 4(1) of Part II of the General Conditions spelled out under License No. EL/T/09-002 that the Licensee shall take immediate remedial action as stated below.

Remedial action

The Licensee shall take all necessary steps with immediate effect to offer the approved tariff for any Generation Licensee who wishes to operate and sell electricity using a Non-Conventional Renewable Energy based generation plant, having capacities below 10 MW, under the Standard Power Purchase Agreements (SPPAs) signed during the period from 1st January 2012 to 31st December 2013 as per the Commission’s Decision on Non-Conventional Renewable Energy Purchasing Tariffs: 2012-2013 issued by the Commission on 5th October 2012,

This Enforcement Order

- Shall take effect on the date shown below.
- Shall be valid till 31st December 2013.
- May be revoked or modified at any time by the Commission, but in any event shall cease to have effect at the end of the period specified above.
