





CEB owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak















Reservoir Levels - as at 06.00 Hr on September 30, 2021





Comparison of Total Reservoir Storage Levels with Past Years














CEB Oil Plant Generation during the Previous day






Major Hydro Generation during the Previous day



Major Incidents during the day -as reported by CEB morning of

September 30, 2021

1) Kelanitissa 220kV GIS -Barge cable tripped at 16:19hrs rejecting 60 MW from the system with indication of "generator/cable

protection tripped". Kelanitissa -Barge cable restored at 22:13hrs.

- 2) Rotational manual load shedding was carried out between 18:19hrs to 19:18hrs due to inadequate generation.
- 3) Kukule spilling stopped at 13:30hrs.
- 4) Laxapana pond spilling stopped at 02:55hrs on 30.09.2021.
- 5) Canyon pond spilling started at 18:12hrs and stopped at 23:54hrs.
- 6) Rantembe Unit 01 made available from 03:28hrs on 30.09.2021 after annual maintenance.
