





CEB owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak






IPP owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak









Reservoir Levels - as at 06.00 Hr on October 27, 2021





Comparison of Total Reservoir Storage Levels with Past Years














CEB Oil Plant Generation during the Previous day






Major Hydro Generation during the Previous day



Major Incidents during the day -as reported by CEB morning of

- 1) Dehiwala 132/33kV T/F 02 tripped at 10:03 hrs with the indication TC oil level low. The T/F was normalized at 12:02 hrs.
- 2) New Chilaw-Veyangoda cct 01 tripped and auto-reclosed at 11:10 hrs due to operation of differential protection.
- 3) New Polpitiya-Thulhiriya-Athurugiriya cct tripped at 11:18 hrs due to operation of main protection. The cct was normalized by 11:35 hrs.
- 4) Canyon pond spilling continues to the present hour. Laxapana pond spilling started at 17:15 hrs and continues to the present hour. Norton pond spilling started at 18:12 hrs and stopped at 00:10 hrs on 27/10/2021.
- 5) Upper Kotmale spilling started at 23:10 hrs and continues to the present hour.
