





CEB owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak






IPP owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak









Reservoir Levels - as at 06.00 Hr on January 6, 2022





Comparison of Total Reservoir Storage Levels with Past Years












CEB Oil Plant Generation during the Previous day



Major Hydro Generation during the Previous day





Major Incidents during the day -as reported by CEB morning of

- 1) N'Anu -Kappalthurai cct tripped and A/R from both ends at 11:51hrs, and cct tripped at 11:53hrs from both ends due to the operation of distance protection . Cct restored at 13:09hrs.
- 2) Balangoda New Galle cct tripped and A/R from both ends at 18:36hrs due to the operation of distance protection.
- 3) KPS GT 07 startup failed at 04:20 hrs (06/01/2022) due to an issue in starter motor . KPS GT07 yet to resume generation.
- 4) Rantembe Gen 01 made unavailable from 04:55hrs (06/01/2022) due to a fault in excitation system. Rant gen 01 yet to resume generation.
