





CEB owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak






IPP owned Tharmal Plant Loading at the Night Peak









Reservoir Levels - as at 06.00 Hr on January 8, 2022





Comparison of Total Reservoir Storage Levels with Past Years



Variation of Demand during the current year













CEB Oil Plant Generation during the Previous day



Major Hydro Generation during the Previous day




